(a) All residential customers inside the corporate limits of the city shall be charged a minimum base fee of \$9.00. Residential users of the city's water service outside the corporate limits shall be charged a minimum base rate fee of \$30.00 per month.

Effective October 1, 2018, the monthly water user charge for all residential customers shall be as follows:

Tier 2	\$4.51	\$5.75

Effective October 1, 2018, the monthly water user charge for all master metered residential customers shall be as follows:

(b) All non-residential customers inside or outside the corporate limits of the city shall be charged a minimum base rate fee of \$25.00.

Effective October 1, 2018, the monthly water user charge for all non-residential customers shall be as follows:

Tier 1	\$3.93
Tier 2	\$4.45
Tier 3	\$5.07
Tier 4	\$5.70

(c) Sprinkler and/or standpipe systems for fire protection shall be charged on a monthly basis, as follows:

(d) All above charges excluding base rate fees, sprinkler and/or standpipe system charges shall be automatically increased on the first day of October of each year (starting October 2019) according to the all items consumer price index for all urban consumers (CPI-U) for the south from the bureau of labor statistics. The magnitude of the increase is determined by the actual percentage rise of the all items CPI-U, but minimum three percent, whichever is greater.
